

TABOR COLLEGE DANTES POLICY

Objective

The DANTES Program was developed by ETS (Educational Testing Service) and approved by the American Council on Education. It was designed in 1983 for an agency of the Department of Defense called DANTES (Defense Activity for Nontraditional Education Support) to help service members obtain credit for knowledge and skills acquired through nontraditional education experiences.

Registration

DANTES exams can be taken at the Tabor's School of Adult and Graduate Studies in Wichita. Information about the cost of the DANTES examination and other locations where the DANTES exams can be taken is available in the Wichita office. Tabor does not charge any fee for granting credit.

Granting of Credit

The maximum amount of credit by examination which may be applied to the 120 semester hours required for the completion of a Bachelor's Degree is 30 hours. Credit received from DANTES examinations will be graded "Credit" and will not be computed in the student's GPA. DANTES credit will be identified on the transcript as credit received through DANTES examinations. DANTES exams may not be used to replace grades earned in residence. A course may be repeated only by re-enrolling and completing a Tabor resident course or by taking an institutional challenge exam.

Students need to submit a copy of their score reports so they can be evaluated according to Tabor's DANTES policy for both the minimum score and the amount of credit given.

Below are the DANTES examinations which Tabor accepts along with the scores required for credit and the manner in which the credit applies toward the degree. A student may not receive credit by examination in a course if more advanced work has been taken in that subject.
