

In accordance with the applicable sections of the CARES Act, CRRSAA, and ARP, Tabor College provides the following information in satisfaction of the required quarterly report.

1. Tabor College has signed and returned the Department of Education (DOE) Certification and Agreement assuring that the institution has used, or intends to use, the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
2. Tabor College has received \$437,303 from the DOE to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
3. As of March 31, 2022, \$437,303 has been distributed to eligible students.
4. Tabor College calculates that 157 students were eligible to receive distributions.
5. As of December 31, 2021 157 students had received emergency financial aid grants.
6. Any student may apply for a grant. Tabor College uses Expected Family Contribution (ERC) as calculated by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine which students to prioritize for grants. Tabor College uses the maximum federal Pell grant award and the remaining funds available as a guide to how much to grant to each student.

This report is current as of 3/31/22. All funds (\$1,347,637) have been distributed and there will be no further updates to this report.
